GRINDLEFORD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY ANNUAL SHOW RULES

1. Entries: the entry fee varies depending on the number of exhibits entered. 1-5 entries = £1, 6-10 entries = £2, 11-20 entries £3.00, over 20 entries £4. The children's section is free of charge. Non-Patrons pay an additional fee of 50p per person.
2. **Each exhibitor must complete a separate entry form.** Entries will be accepted on Thursday, 17th August at the Bishop Pavilion between 6.00 pm. & 8.30 pm.
3. No late entries can be accepted.
4. Staging of exhibits: staging is from 8.00 am on the day of the Show and must be completed by 9.45 am – **this rule will be enforced.** No exhibits or cards may be removed before the presentation of trophies.
5. For classes 1 – 94 all exhibits must be the property of the exhibitors. All horticultural exhibits must have been grown in the exhibitor's own garden or allotment. The name of variety is to be shown where possible.
6. Multiple Exhibits: exhibitors can enter multiple exhibits in a class but can only win one prize. Two or more persons may not compete separately in the same class with produce from the same garden or allotment.
7. Art & Craft: entries in the Art & Craft section must not have been exhibited previously at Grindleford Show.
8. The Committee reserves the right to decide on any matter not covered by these rules.

Notes for Judges

1. Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) rules will be applied by the judges for all flower and vegetable classes.
2. Judges may not award a prize if entries are of insufficient merit.
3. Judges may handle exhibits, open pods etc. to check for quality.
4. Judges should use their discretion when judging the Tray class remembering that entries may not come from regular exhibitors.
5. Points awarded should be marked by the judges on the exhibitors' scorecard.

Information for Exhibitors

1. Classes – most classes in the show are 'open'... we welcome exhibitors from outside Grindleford. Some classes and trophies are for residents & allotment holders in Grindleford parish only.
2. A novice exhibitor is someone who has not previously exhibited at the Grindleford Show.
3. Any queries that may arise, regarding anything other than the above rules, should be referred to, and decided by, the show officials.
4. Failure to abide by any of the show rules will lead to disqualification.
5. Presentation of trophies will take place at 4.00pm with prize money to be collected from 4.15pm.
6. Prize money for each class will be 1st £1.50, 2nd £1, 3rd 50p*
 - a. *Except in classes 10, 11, 53, 111, 112, 113 & 142. Prize money for these classes is shown in the schedule.
7. Raffle & Auction: The raffle will be drawn at 4.15pm followed at 4.30pm by an auction of donated and unclaimed exhibits.

How to exhibit

1. Complete the attached entry form for each class you wish to enter.
2. **A separate form is required for each exhibitor.** Extra forms are available from the Community Shop, Sir William Hotel or on registration night.
3. When entering the Art & Craft section, the dimensions of your exhibit are needed so that a suitable place can be allocated.
4. **For classes 128, 129, 131, 132 please write your name on the back of work/photo and bring your work to registration.**
5. Take your form, together with the appropriate fee, to: Bishop Pavilion – 6.00pm to 8.30pm on Thursday 17th August.

Important Notes:

1. You may stage your exhibit(s) from 8.00am until 9.45 am on Show Day.
 2. Use the tables provided at the marquee entrance to prepare your exhibit.
 3. Check to make sure your exhibit conforms to the class details.
 4. Judging begins at 10.00am prompt.
 5. Exhibits must not be removed before 4.30pm.
- The ROYAL BANKSIAN MEDAL and other SPECIAL PRIZES are listed overleaf.

The **ROYAL BANKSIAN MEDAL** and other **SPECIAL PRIZES** are awarded for specific categories and these are listed in the Royal Banksian Medal and Show Trophies section overleaf

ROYAL BANKSIAN MEDAL

This medal has been granted to the Society by the Royal Horticultural Society,

'To be awarded to the winner of the highest number of points in the whole of the Horticultural classes in the show.'

In classes 1-103 each exhibitor shall score 3 points for first place, 2 for second place and 1 for third.

Any exhibitor who has won the Banksian Medal at the Grindleford Show in the last two years is not eligible to win this medal.

Should two exhibitors obtain equal scores then the award should go to the one who has taken the greater number of first prizes unless he/she has previously won a Banksian medal and the other has not.

Class 10. THE REYNOLDS TROPHY for an arrangement of flowers & vegetables.

(Cup donated by Mr T Reynolds) Sponsored by Two Wests and Elliott
Winner 2022 I Fretwell

Rules

1. Any 1 class of flowers from classes 71 to 94 in the schedule PLUS any 1 class of vegetables from classes 31 to 51 in the schedule. The number of each selected vegetable or flower is to be the same as specified in each selected class.
2. **Display:** The flowers and vegetable(s) are to be displayed together for effect. The maximum space allowed is 18" (45 cm) the width of a show bench.
3. **Marks awarded:** Each class of flowers and vegetable(s) will be marked out of 20; giving a total of 40 basic points. Additionally, bonuses will be given for allotment grown (10%), organically grown. (10%): each being calculated from the basic mark awarded. It MUST be stated on entry form if ALL items displayed have been allotment / organically grown. If not stated, it will be deemed they have not. Please write on the back of the entry form and card if organically grown.

Class 11. THE GRINDLEFORD GARDENER'S TRAY CLASS

Sponsored by JPR Farm Direct Ltd.

Winner 2022 I Fretwell

Rules

1. The Tray class is a collection of three types of vegetables from the following list of eight.
2. The quantity of each vegetable is given in brackets: Carrots (2), Cauliflower (1), Onion (2), Parsnips (2), Peas (3 pods), Potatoes (2), Runner beans (3 pods), Tomatoes (3). Each vegetable type will be judged out of a total of 20 points. The overall mark will therefore be out of 60.
3. All vegetables are to be displayed for effect and in an area measuring 18 in. x 24 in. (45 x 60 cm). No part of any exhibit may exceed the size of the tray. A tray/board can be used to display the vegetables, or the area can simply be marked on the staging. Where a tray has a lip or edge, the internal measurements must not exceed 18 in. by 24 in. (45 x 60 cm).
4. A black cloth is permitted, and the tray may be painted. Parsley is allowed for garnishing, but no other foliage or accessories, such as plates, sand, rings etc will be allowed. Onion tops may be tied or whipped using raffia or string.
5. The winner of the Grindleford Gardener's Tray class will receive £10. The runner up will receive £8. Third place will receive £5.
